
Some of Mr. Smith's happiest moments as a teacher have been at the East Alton-Wood River Communiy High School. He is very grateful for the courtesy and consideration which the students have shown him, both in and out of school. In 1955 members of the faculty presented Mr. Smith with a plaque which commemorated their gift of a life membership in the National Education Association.

Mr. Smith would like to be remembered for his efforts to bring beauty to the buildings and to the campus; also, for his desire to make the school a purposive place to develop pupil responsibility. He stated, "One of the greatest purposes of Education is to ennoble. Another is to raise the level of human living. I have always wanted to conduct myself around school as we expect pupils to conduct themselves!"

Mr. A. Edson Smith began his teaching career in Neponset, Illinois, during the 1920's. There he taught mathematics, English, and music; he also directed plays and coached athletics. After two years, Mr. Smith became superintendent. His work consisted of teaching at Neponset in the mornings and supervising ten rural schools in the afternoons. Through Mr. Smith's efforts, Neponset became one of the first consolidated school districts in the state of Ilinois.

Mr. Smith taught mathematics at Granite City where he also coached and organized the school bands. He was principal at Anna-Jonesboro for ten years, and also at the Galesburg High School for three years, as well as for four years at Robinson, Illinois, where he became superintendent of the community schools for two years. In 1949, Mr. Smith moved to the East Alton-Wood River School System. This year marks the completion of his forty-third year of teaching.

Mr. Smith has seen many changes in the schools during his teaching experience. These changes cover many years, from the time when he drank out of a rusty tin can at the one-room rural school's well to now, when our water







The achievements of the Fine Arts Department are highlighted by the April presentation of the Fine Arts Festival. This colorful production presents a culmination of the department activities.








NATIONAL THESPIANS
