

assemblies. This year the Girls Glee Club will especially be remembered for their special part in the Coronation festivities.




FUTURE NURSES




JUNIOR ENGINEERS

INDUSTRIAL EDUCATION CLUB



In addition to participating in meets, the gymnastics team provides half-time exhibitions at the basketball


